

FIRST AID MEASURES

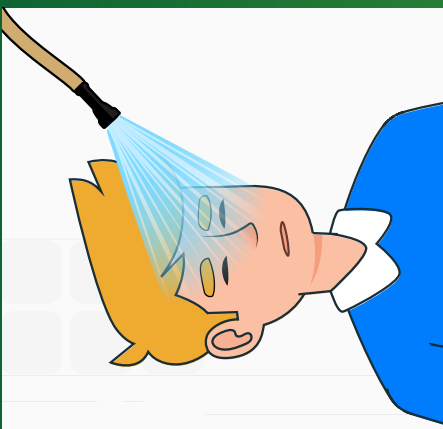
IN CASE OF ACCIDENTS WITH — PESTICIDES —

It is easier to prevent than to treat poisoning, so always read the label instructions. In the event of an incident, these are the steps you should follow:



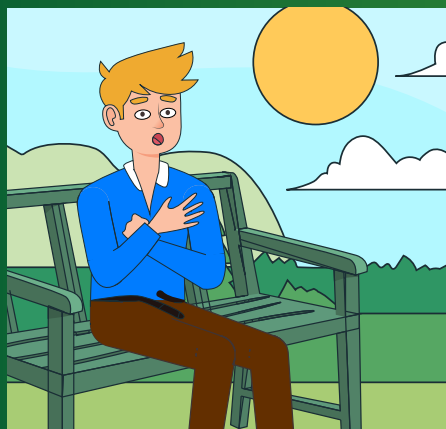
SKIN:

If pesticides come into contact with your skin, remove any contaminated clothing and wash the skin with plenty of soap and water.



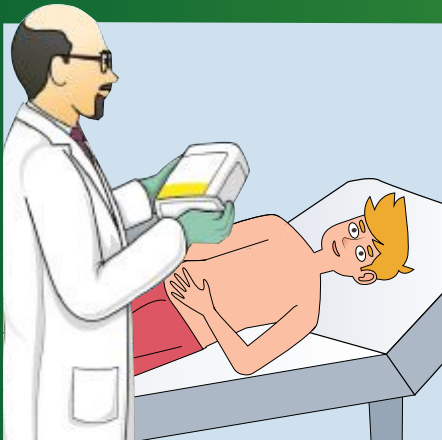
EYES:

If pesticides come into contact with your eyes, flush them with a gentle stream for at least 15 minutes. Wash each eye individually from the inside (tear side) out to avoid cross contamination.



INHALATION:

If you accidentally inhale pesticides, find a ventilated place where you can breathe fresh air. Loosen your shirt and belt. If the person stops breathing, artificial respiration should be applied using appropriate equipment and technique.



MOUTH:

If you accidentally ingest pesticides, you should immediately seek medical help as soon as possible. Do not drink anything. Stay as comfortable and calm as possible and do not induce vomiting.

REMEMBER

to ensure your own safety before helping others, and after following these first aid steps, seek medical help as quickly as possible and always carry the product label with you.
